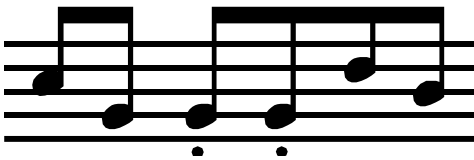
INTRODUCTION:

Good liturgy involves a good environment for the liturgical celebration, good music and singing during the liturgical celebration and a good message that is presented by the presider at the particular liturgical celebration

Each of these elements need to be present at a particular liturgical celebration such as Sunday masses and special liturgical celebrations such as; Baptisms, Confirmations, funerals and marriages.

But most importantly each of these elements need to heard by those present in the church.

The Sound System Ministry is needed to make this happen at the many liturgical celebrations that take place at St. Theresa's church.



THE NEED:

Every weekend at St. Theresa's church there are 6 masses and other liturgical celebrations. That is a total of 450+ liturgical celebrations per year.

An upgrade of our sound system was recently completed and the way the system now operates requires monitoring by one or two individuals when in use.

These individuals are needed to monitor the various components of our new system:

- Monitor the sound levels throughout the church at the sound system booth in the back of the church.
- Operate the 2-screen video projection system t the sound system booth in the back of the church.

Extensive hardware and software training will be provided for those who would like to be a part of the Sound System ministry but have concerns about dealing with this type of technology.
